CEO's Report

Despite ongoing challenges throughout 2021, Kadimah continued to adapt, change and grow as an organisation. My own role changed in November when I transitioned from Board Member to Interim CEO, and later CEO.

Multiple COVID lockdowns during 2021 saw Kadimah's programming pivot back and forth between live and online events.

FEBRUARY: We commenced 2021 with a three-way collaboration with The Hellenic Museum and The Boite with *The Figtree Replanted*, two sold-out live concerts of music and storytelling featuring Australian performers from Greek, Jewish and Italian backgrounds. Set in the idyllic gardens of Melbourne's historic Hellenic Museum (and streamed online) the show reinterpreted The Fig Tree, the award-winning musical companion to Arnold Zable's book of short stories.

MARCH: In One Voice festival returned in a COVID-safe format. The For One Night concert featured a spectacular line-up including high-energy 23-piece collective YID!, ground-breaking Yiddish salsa band Mishn, and new Yiddish electronica act Durkh A Modne Gloz, held in an exciting indoor / outdoor setting, offering both seated and standing tickets, with kosher food vans and a pop-up bar. For One Day, the day-time festival, was run as an indoor/outdoor event with limited capacity crowds.

APRIL: Romi Kupfer produced *Definitely Not The Worst Thing In The World* showcasing young Jewish people collaborating with Jewish artists to turn the madness of 2020 into an immersive theatrical performance.

MAY: Kadimah Yiddish Theatre performed a pilot radio "listening party" of *The Cantor*, an original radio play. Ernie Gruner conducted several online klezmer and nigunim music workshops. We launched *Klub Kadimah*, a new residency for live music and performance. The first show, *Simon Starr and Friends*, brought a new vibe to the Kadimah with a pop-up bar and nibbles, in a casual social atmosphere, and showcased some of the best in Jewish music including pianist Luke Howard and newcomer vocalist Camilla Burrows.

JULY: An online panel, Linguicide and Language Reclamation: Yiddish and Aboriginal Perspectives, celebrated NAIDOC Week in collaboration with the ACJC exploring the work of Yiddishists and Aboriginal Languages Advocates and what our communities can learn from each other. We also hosted a series of live online talks with UK-based Professor Dovid Katz, including The Past, Present and Future of Yiddish and Yiddish Dialects.

AUGUST: We facilitated *Stories of Yiddish Melbourne*, a live online event with Christa Whitney, Director of the Wexler Oral History Project at the Yiddish Book Center in Amherst, Massachusetts, who shared observations

from the 30+ oral history interviews she recorded with Yiddish speakers in Melbourne in 2017.

SEPTEMBER: Together with Dunera and Poetica's Miriam Hechtman, Kadimah co-presented *Yiddish Poetica 2*, our second live international online open mic evening of poetry and song. And later YIVO's Eddy Portnoy presented a live online talk from New York about the *Life and Death of a Yiddish Puppet Theatre*.

OCTOBER: Dr Margaret Taft (ACJC) launched Kadimah's new digital archive and explored how more than a century of Annual Reports can help paint a bigger picture of our immigrant community. We also presented an online *Yiddish Parlour Gig* with comedian Justine Sless, the Kvetcher in the Wry.

NOVEMBER: Kadimah re-opened to live audiences with the sell-out season of *Durkh a Modne Gloz/Through A Strange Lens*, an avante-garde theatrical experience fusing Yiddish poetry and electronic music created by composer Josh Abrahams and writer/performer Galit Klas.

DECEMBER: Launching Kadimah's 110th Anniversary, we celebrated with Scraps of Heaven: A Live Tribute to the Novel by Arnold Zable. This tribute event to the beloved novel creatively combined dramatic monologues, audiobook soundbites and live performance

by musician Toby Bender and his band. The event also launched the new audiobook of the novel produced by Evelyn Krape. Our final event was *Biz 120: Celebrating the life and Work of Itzik Manger*, a documentary co-produced by Kadimah and the Bund paying homage to the beloved Yiddish poet. As the year ended, rehearsals for the acclaimed *Yentl* began in earnest, filling the Kadimah with activity well into 2022.

All our Yiddish classes and shmues groups continued throughout 2021, both in person and online.

At the conclusion of 2021, Kadimah introduced new branding to the world. A new, fresh exciting look to introduce our 110th year in continuous operation as a Jewish cultural organisation.

Kadimah Yiddish Theatre

Kadimah has championed Yiddish theatre in Melbourne since its establishment in 1911.

Yiddish theatre played a significant role in Melbourne's early Jewish cultural life, entertaining growing numbers of Yiddish-speaking migrants nostalgic for the world they had left behind. From 1905, small troupes performed operettas, literary plays and comedies, but the establishment of the Kadimah in 1911, as an independent cultural organisation, created the framework to support generations of theatre-makers: The Kadimah Theatre Circle and The Yiddish Stage (1927-1939), the David Herman Theatre at the Kadimah (1938-1992, now the subject of a new documentary which premièred in March 2022), and the Melbourne Yiddish Youth Theatre (1973-1998).

In 2019, the Kadimah Board added 'Kadimah Yiddish Theatre' (KYT) to its stable of cultural activities. Yiddish language is at the heart of all that Kadimah does and KYT walks proudly

in two worlds, honouring the rich traditions of Yiddish theatre, language and culture while creating contemporary Australian work.

The creative team behind the KYT burst onto the scene in 2016 with several productions and cabarets (Sholem Aleichem: Not Dead Yet 2016, Balaganeyden: A Messy Paradise 2016, The Ghetto Cabaret: A Night To Remember 2017, Shikered 2018, Yiddish Divas 2018). As word spread and popularity grew, this Yiddish-loving group inspired by acclaimed Melbourne actor Evelyn Krape and writer/ performer/director Galit Klas evolved as the only contemporary bilingual Yiddish English theatre company in Australia and one of only a handful around the world.

In 2019, KYT reached out to the wider community, taking Yiddish theatre to new venues and broader audiences. The second run of *The Ghetto Cabaret* (fortyfive downstairs), *Yiddish Divas Returns* (Melbourne Cabaret Festival, Chapel-off-Chapel) and

Fun Yener Zayt Lid/Play Me A Poem (National Theatre) saw sold out performances, Green Room Awards and Nominations, and critical success.

Throughout two years of COVID lockdowns, the KYT continued to create unique Australian works. In 2020 they recorded a series of Shakespeare monologues in Yiddish and a pilot radio play *The Cantor*. In 2021, Klas collaborated with composer Josh Abrahams, combining mid century Yiddish poetry with electronic music to create an original cabaret-style show *Durkh a Modne Gloz/Through A Strange Lens*. Krape recorded a new audiobook version of Arnold Zable's novel *Scraps of Heaven* followed by a collaboration with musician Toby Bender to adapt it into a dramatic musical tribute. Both productions played to sold-out audiences.

The success of the KYT today reflects a global revival of Yiddish, recognised by UNESCO as an endangered language and regarded

as a symbol of resilience and identity for minority groups and subcultures worldwide. This culminated with *Yentl* which represents a major milestone for Kadimah and the KYT, taking Yiddish theatre to the Australian main stage. *Yentl* was originally scheduled for 2021 and was eventually staged in March 2022 to tremendous applause.

"Yentl is by far one of the theatrical experiences of the year, a holy and aspirational work that shows us that, far from being the enemy of progress, religion can have a transformative place in our society. The only sin here would be if a single seat remained empty during this short, stunning run."

Library & Learning

The National Library "Kadimah" was founded in 1911 and served the cultural and intellectual needs of the vibrant, Jewish migrant community and later Yiddish speaking communities of Melbourne.

The library acknowledges key supporters and has dedicated special collections as follows:

- Yasha Sher Reading Room
- Bono Weiner Collection
- Genia and Chaim Borensztajn Holocaust Memorial – Yizkor Collection
- Moishe Rabinowicz Multimedia Research Centre
- Dafner Family Yiddish Audio-Visual Radio Collection.

The library also supports the Yosef Gilligich Foundation and shares an online catalogue network with "The Lamm Jewish Library of Australia".

"I just wanted to thank you so much for the Yiddish classes this year. It has been great. The best language class I have ever taken and truly the only zoom meeting I ever looked forward to." The Kadimah library is the most comprehensive collection of publishing in Yiddish in Australia. The collections include fiction published both locally and overseas, history, memoir, biography, books for children, Yizkor books, journals, newspapers and periodicals. It also includes film, recordings of guest lectures at the Kadimah from the 1970s – now in themselves interesting primary material – archive and music scores. The collections have grown from thoughtful donations from individuals and families.

Although the library was closed to the public for most of 2021 the dedicated library volunteers continued to work safely and tirelessly to maintain the collection. Fundamental to the strategic plan is preservation of unique items and making collections accessible through digitisation. The Board expresses its thanks to Freda Freiberg and the Leo & Mina Fink Fund for support to digitise the Kadimah's Annual Reports from 1911 – 2000. These reports provide insights into the political, social

and artistic progress of the Kadimah, and the issues and interests of the Jewish community in Melbourne. This task was completed in 2021.

Similarly, we are grateful to the City of Glen Eira for a community grant to build capacity for library volunteers in digitising collections. Volunteer safety during 2020 has meant this project was delayed and progressed throughout 2021.

Kurt Langfelder who developed procedures for the stocktake of the library and led this mammoth task which commenced in 2021 and continues in 2022, with the support of numerous volunteers.

The library was supported in 2021 by the Library and Learning Committee including: Judith Reuben (Chair) Kate Prinsley (former CEO), Jake Dessauer, Rose Blustein, Esther Singer, Alex Dafner, Kurt Langfelder, Andrew Markus AM and Rachel Kalman OAM.

The heart and soul of the library is its volunteers. 


Treasurer's Report

In 2021 the Kadimah family lost two of its stalwarts Yosl Winkler and David Burstin.

Yosl Winkler 1928-2021

Yosl Winkler served as a Kadimah committee and board member for over 60 years. For many years he was Treasurer and Vice President of the Kadimah. David Burstin 1937-2021

At the time of his passing David was a director on the Kadimah Board. In his interview by the Wexler oral history Project in 2017 he and his brother Ben discussed their parents' immigration to Australia, described the Jewish community of their Carlton childhood in Melbourne, and reflected on their own relationships to Yiddish and Yiddishkayt and the Jewish community. David's lifelong commitment to the Melbourne Jewish community has had a resounding impact and he is remembered dearly by many.
